
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Highest recognition from the Ministry of Education and Science for the work of the University of Ruse

The Rector was elected Academician of BAS

26 October, 2021

On 26 October 2021, the Rector of the University of Ruse "Angel Kanchev", Prof. Hristo Beloev, DTSc, was elected by the meeting of the academicians of BAS, for Academician in the field of engineering sciences.

"This is high evaluation not just for me but also for the research teams from the country and abroad, which I am managing, for the engineering community in the country, for the University of Ruse and our city", shared Academician Beloev.

Academician Hristo Ivanov Beloev was born in 1958. He is a leading Bulgarian scientist in the field of research, development and implementation of modern agricultural machinery and new antierosion, energy saving and environmentally friendly technologies for flat and sloping terrain. In 2014, he was elected a corresponding member of BAS.

Academician Hristo Beloev is the Rector of the University of Ruse for a third mandate and a professor in the Agrarian and Industrial Faculty. He is the Chairperson of the Union of Scientists – Ruse Branch, and a member of the Municipal Council of Ruse.

He has been awarded many times by national and international institutions, academic and research organisations, universities, associations. One of the significant distinctions is St. St. Cyril and Methodius Order – 1st degree conferred by the President of the Republic of Bulgaria, for outstanding merits in the field of education and science in 2015.

22 May, 2021

On 21st May 2021 the official groundbreaking ceremony for the education and research complex with the University of Ruse took place. The ceremony started with welcoming words by the rector of the University, Cor. Mem. Prof. Hristo Beloev, DTSc. The Mayor of Ruse, Mr. Pencho Milkov, congratulated the audience as well. The event was attended by the Vice mayors of Ruse and the Regional Governor of Ruse, Borislav Bulgarinov.

The groundbreaking was performed by the Rector of the University, the Mayor of Ruse Municipality, the Regional Governor of Ruse region and Mr. Iliyan Iliev – a representative of the contractor company "Roan-90".

The total value of the project is 5 million BGN, with 3 million granted by the state, and the rest – own funds of the University. The education and research complex is expected to be finished by the summer of 2022.

The building will be L-shaped and two-storeyed. In the smaller part, on an area of $1000 \, \text{m}^2$, study halls, labs and offices will be incorporated.

In the longer part, on 2000 m² there will be an exhibition area and seven advanced interdisciplinary laboratories: Laboratory of Precise technologies for sustainable agriculture and protection of natural resources; Laboratory of Multi-modal human-machine interface and systems for 3D kinematics and special visualisation; Laboratory of Digital, additive, energy-assisted innovative technologies; Laboratory of Low carbon mobility and intelligent transport systems; Laboratory of Digital energy systems 4.0; Laboratory of Educational space of the future; Laboratory of Advanced health technologies.

These laboratories are multi-disciplinary and in each of them scientists and specialists from various professional fields will be working, which will enhance the development and implementation of new technologies, together with the business.

The newly built university research complex will enable companies, universities and institutes in the country and abroad to work collaboratively and participate in major science development projects.



Scientific conference of the University of Ruse 2021 and 5D ALLIANCE



The 60-ieth International Scientific Conference of the University of Ruse was opened by Prof. Diana Antonova, PhD – vice-rector of research, who greeted the participants in the study hall, as well as the numerous researchers, attending online. The forum brought together researchers from 17 countries and partners in the research family of 5D ALLIANCE.

On the eve of the Day of the Awakeners, the University of Ruse opened its 60-ieth International Scientific Conference of the University and the Union of Scientists – Ruse with the plenary paper of the Rector, Academician Hristo Beloev, on the topic "Modernisation of higher education in Bulgaria and the role of the regional university".

The Conference was held in the period 28–30 October 2021, including the plenary session and 28 parallel virtual thematic sessions, in which researchers from 17 countries in Europe and Asia presented 314 research papers, united around the leading topic of the scientific event "New industries, digital economy, society – projections of the future IV". This is the fourth edition on this topic, due to the interest of scientists from Bulgaria and abroad in researching various processes, trends and practices in the conditions of transforming socio-economic environment – from regional to global dimensions. As part of the Conference, sessions were held in the Branches in Silistra (15 October 2021), and Razgrad (5 November 2021), which comes as confirmation of the role of the University of Ruse as a factor for the development of the regions.

A major event in the Conference agenda was the First official meeting of the project partners in Digital technological systems for clean and secure environment – 5D ALLIANCE", part of the National Roadmap of research infrastructure of the Republic of Bulgaria. The project is coordinated by the University of Ruse and is unique as it aims to design and develop a hybrid type of digital distributed research infrastructure, which should be a driving force for socio-economic progress in the Danube microregion.

5D ALLIANCE unites 11 universities and institutes in the country and 13 associated partners. The partner meeting was held on 29 October 2021 with the participation of rectors and directors of research institutes and organisations – full members of the Alliance. At this meeting, the plans for

the development of the consortium infrastructure was presented and a legal form of registration was chosen.

5D ALLIANCE unites in one family teams of researchers, who interact without borders, find innovative solutions for industries by developing their potential in the context of global connectivity, shared resources, know-how and expertise. The concept of 5D ALLIANCE is not just an illustration of Ruse University and its partners' vision for modernisation in the field of research, but also a step forward on the path of open science in Bulgaria.

"I am convinced that the energy, innovation and combined efforts, capacity and resources of all partners in 5D ALLIANCE will allow us to build a shared research infrastructure, significant for the future of Bulgaria and the Danube area, which will spread new horizons for many young researchers!" – shared Academician Beloev.

The project was highly estimated by the European Commission and the Ministry of Education and Science when selecting proposals, which would become part of the National Roadmap of research infrastructure of the Republic of Bulgaria at the end of last year. The role of this Map is to prioritize the research sites of importance, so that they can receive administrative, technical and financial support in the future for the implementation of significant research projects.

The academic event continued with two more plenary papers. Assoc. prof. Alexander Kunchev, PhD in the Ministry of healthcare – Chief State Inspector of Healthcare, presented a paper on: "Conclusions for public health, imposed by the pandemic", and Assoc. prof. Mateo Rossi – Sanio University, Bienvenutto, Italy, and an associate professor in corporate finance in LUISS, Rome, Italy, presented a paper on the topic: "ESG (environment, social control and governance) and corporative financial result: the mediating role of green innovations. Examples of European companies".

The topics of the plenary sessions are relevant for our time and arouse the interest not only of the scientific community, but also of the whole society.

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Conferences at the University of Ruse, 2021

International conference on the topic of Diversity

On 5-6 June in the halls of Kaneff Centre of the University of Ruse, an international conference was held with the special participation of HE Christoph Eichhorn, Ambassador of FR Germany in the Republic of Bulgaria, organised by the Bulgarian-Romania Interuniversity Europe centre (BRIE) on the topic of Diversity. The conference was organised within the framework of the annual Danube school under the motto "Danube, inclusive, empathetic and responsive society based on European values".



In the beginning of the conference, a retrospective analysis was made of Elias Canetti's works. In 1981, New York Times noted that Elias Canetti was the first writer born in Bulgaria, who has won a Nobel Prize. In fact, the author's identity is more often connected with his birthplace – Ruse (then Rustchuk), a city, originating more than 23 centuries ago on the River Danube!

For the rest of his life, Elias Canetti repeatedly returned to his childhood memories. In "The tongue set free"(1977) he wrote about his native town: "You could hear seven or eight languages every day. There were Bulgarians, Turks, Greeks, Albanians, Armenians and Gypsies, together with two groups of Jews, who hated each other heartily – the Sephardi's, who spoke Ladino, a type of archaic Spanish, and the Ashkenazi". The cultural diversity that surrounded him left its mark on his later insights into the nature of human mind and the existence of "irrational" biases. He grew up as a polyglot and a student of world cultures, including those of nations and groups, which had received little or no attention. Canetti's works reveal his multilingual life and his experience with various cultural influences.



Today is also a time for responsibility. The difference is labelled as a dangerous alien manifestation. The cultural, ethnical and religious diversity in Europe after the migration crisis is associated yet again with fear, born out of the contact with alien cultures. The project Diversity is a proof of such resistance. The partners have studied cultural communities in Ruse and along the Danube. The results from the study are shared among a wide audience of students and young professionals. The lecturers, the role play, the special participation of HE Christoph Eichhorn and the cultural programme were dedicated to getting to know the different cultures without prejudices and with respect for their achievements. The conference participants believe that in this way, they add value to the social design of a Danube inclusive,

Conference CompSysTech

June 2021

In June 2021, the 22nd International Scientific Conference in Computer Systems and Technologies CompSysTech was held at the University of Ruse. The rector of the University, Cor. Mem. Prof. Hristo Beloev, DTSc welcomed the participants and wished them successful participation.



The plenary papers were as follows:

Prof. Rumyana Peycheva-Forsait – Director of the National Centre for Distance Learning - The effect of the teachers' experience in online education during the pandemic on their views of strengths and weaknesses of e-learning;

Prof. Martin Vechev, PhD – Professor in Computer Science at ETH Zurich, "Certified Deep Learning";

Prof. Dr. Yiorgos Chrysanthou – Professor in Computer Science at University of Cyprus, - "Data Driven Character Simulation".

There were 40 research papers presented in 6 sections. Academician Peter Kenderov has initiated the participation of high school students, who already have certain achievements in the field of computing. So once again this year he supervised the high school students section and guided the future researchers.

The authors with the greatest scientific contribution were awarded with the Crystal Prize Best Paper. For 13 years now the papers, presented at CompSysTech have been published in the virtual library of the Association for Computing Machinery and are indexed by SCOPUS, which is an indicator for the scientific value of the conference.

On the first day of the conference, reports were presented by the academic management of the university and the graduates of BRIE. The first day ended with a role play "If I were you", prepared by PhD students in political studies and the improvisation troupe ViZHna! led by Ivaylo Nenov and Iliyan Ilkov. The second day was dedicated to the special participation of HE Ambassador Christoph Eichhorn on the topic "One bed – different dreams? German – Bulgarian discussion about Europe". More than 100 young people – students from the University of Ruse and from the high schools in our town, took part in the discussion. The cultural programme at the end of the conference included visits to historical sites in Ruse.

The organisers from BRIE express their gratitude to HE Ambassador Christoph Eichhorn and to Mila Ilieva – officer at the Embassy of the Federal Republic of Germany in the Republic of Bulgaria.

BRIE is the only cross-border educational and research structure in Southeast Europe that is developing on the basis of an international agreement and conducts training for international students (in English with additional classes in German and Romanian language) in Master degree programmes. The network includes the University of Ruse, the Academy of Economics – Bucharest, as well as the German Universities in Regensburg, Viadrina and Kemnits.

Innovative events and projects

University Botanical Garden

On 27 May 2021, the academic community of the University of Ruse saw the opening of the University Botanical Garden, with some species which are over 100 years old.

The activity for investigating the possibility of setting up a University Botanical Garden started back in the summer of 2020, when a detailed research was conducted on the flora species variety in the park of the University of Ruse. The work was done by Petya Angelova, PhD, a lecturer in Botany and Taxonomy of Plants, and students from the degree programme Plant Growing with the Agrarian and Industrial Faculty of the University of Ruse.

As a result of the research, it was revealed that the park hosts over 300 local and foreign tree and shrub species, which, together with the diversity of forms count to about 400 taxons. When identifying the age of the flora species, it was found out that some of them were planted in the years before the Liberation of Bulgaria in the 19th century.

Given the impressive results of the study, the idea arose to expose the dendrological collection of the park of the University of Ruse and to turn the territory into a botanical garden, by categorizing and documenting the plants grown in it for scientific purposes. The plant species are presented with their names according to the internationally established botanical nomenclature.

Gradual reconstruction of the existing green areas and enrichment of the plant collection is planned, while the species' diversity is to be exposed by creating dendrological routes with information boards.

Currently, the Botanical garden has a Rose garden and an Orchard. Several more thematic corners are to be established: herb garden, Alpine garden with



cold-resistant succulent plants, a nook of decorative grasses, a greenhouse, etc. When all this is done, the University Botanical Garden will become an interesting, beautiful and unique park, provoking interest in botany and initiatives related to environmental education and art for all ages.

The aim of the University Botanical Garden is to demonstrate the richness and diversity of both native tree and shrub species and foreign ones. At the moment there can be seen typical tree, shrub and grass representatives of the Bulgarian

flora, as well as foreign species. In addition to exotic species in the garden, there is an opportunity to see rare trees such as paper, liquidamber, ancient representatives of the two-part ginkgo biloba and metasequoia.

The creation of the University Botanical Garden is a long creative process that requires not only a lot of special knowledge, but also patience and constant care. Undoubtedly, the leading place in this process belongs to the professionals, but the academic community of the university welcomes every support from the hearts of our fellow citizens, local institutions and organizations, for whom increasing the green wealth of our city is a cause.

Development of electronic surveillance in the Republic of Bulgaria

On 16 April 2021 the University of Ruse, together with the Ministry of Justice and Directorate General Execution of Sentences carried out a practical training "Development of electronic surveillance in the Republic of Bulgaria". At the same time, the Day of the Bulgarian Constitution and the professional holiday of the Bulgarian lawyers were celebrated.



The Rector of the University of Ruse Cor.Mem. Prof. Hristo Beloey, DTSc opened the meeting and noted that the topic of the workshop is extremely important and up-to-date. The vice-Minister of Justice, Prof. Nikolay Prodanov and Chief Commissioner Ivaylo Yordanov – Director of Directorate General Execution of Sentences also spoke at the opening.

Faculty of Law, University of Ruse, and Ch. Assistant Professor Dr. Svetlin Antonov - Head of the Department of Criminal Law and Security at the Faculty of Law, University of Ruse and Head of the Arrests Department at the Regional Service for the Execution of Sentences – Ruse.

Various aspects of electronic surveillance, penalties and other restrictive measures were presented by the lecturers to the court representatives in Ruse, the Prosecutor's Office, the Ministry of Interior, the General Directorate for Execution of Sentences and its territorial services, lawyers, professors, professors, PhD students and students at the University of Ruse. The training also included a

discussion on issues related to the practical application of electronic surveillance.

In addition to the presentations given by the guests on the topic, there was a demonstration of the work of technical devices through which electronic monitoring is carried out.

The event was also broadcast online, where many students, PhD students, lecturers and practitioners took part.

International Earth Day

On 22 April 2021, the University of Ruse celebrated the Earth Day and the Day of Trees, celebrated in China. To mark the activity of the study hall "Confucius" with the University of Ruse, three coniferous trees were planted and a special plate was put by them as a sign of the eternal friendship between Bulgaria and China. European Universities Association

At the end of April 2021, the European Universities Association celebrated its twentieth anniversary. The University of Ruse has been a part of it for more than ten years. On the occasion of the holiday, Cor. Mem. Innovative project

The University of Ruse designed and built a river vessel with hybrid power – solar panel, electrical battery, hydrogen fuel cell

On November 25, 2021 in the waters of the Danube near Silistra was held the first demonstration voyage of the upgraded ecological vessel HydRUforce with hybrid drive based on solar energy - battery - hydrogen fuel cell. It is the first of its kind in Bulgaria and is the result from the work of a team of the Angel Kanchev University of Ruse with partners from various institutions - BAS, Technical University - Sofia, Ruse Municipality and Silistra Municipality.

The event was attended by the Mayor of Silistra Julian Naydenov, PhD, the Regional Governor of Silistra Eli Todorova and the Deputy Governor Mincho Yordanov, the Deputy Mayor of Ruse Dimitar Nedev, representatives of the Maritime Administration, the Vice-Rector of the University of Ruse Prof. Dr. Plamen Daskalov, the Dean of the Faculty of Transport Assoc. Prof. Dr. Assen Assenov and the Director of the Branch of the University of Ruse Assoc. Prof. Dr. Rumyana Lebedova, professors, students and citizens.

Prof. Plamen Daskalov, who is also part of the team, greeted all participants on behalf of the academic management of the university and presented diplomas to the team, signed by the Rector Academician Hristo Belovev.

The development has zero carbon emissions and is under the National Research Program "Low Carbon Energy in Transport and Life" (E Plus), funded by the Ministry of Education and Science. The additional financial resource is from the University of Ruse - the academic capital of Northern Bulgaria.

The presentation was opened by the project manager Prof. Dr. Velizara Pencheva from the University of Ruse, to whom the regional governor Eli Todorova handed a special congratulatory address. It states: "I wish you to successfully continue your pre-announced intentions to legalize the vessel, as well as the subsequent tests and evaluations of individual elements set out in the project."

The Mayor of Silistra Dr. Julian Naydenov thanked the University of Ruse for the opportunity to create a vessel based on a pontoon with a solar roof, built under the project "Clean Access in the cross-border area Silistra - Calarasi", funded by a cross-border cooperation program. On the Bulgarian side, the Municipality of Silistra and the University of Ruse are partners again.

In her speech, Assoc. Prof. Dr. Rumyana Lebedova - Director of the Silistra Branch, said that students from the engineering department of the university have participated in the project, which for them is an invaluable practical and



scientific experience. Together with other participants in it - professors, associate professors and doctoral students, they received congratulatory letters on behalf of Academician Hristo Belovev - Rector of the University of Ruse.

Assoc. Prof. Assen Assenov presented the main systems of the vessel and together with the other members of the team - Assoc. Prof. Ivan Beloev, Assoc. Prof. Dimitar Grozev and Assoc. Prof. Tsvetelina Georgieva, answered questions. They were actively supported by the doctoral students Eng. Valeri Georgiev and Eng. Stoyan Nyagolov.

A congratulatory address was also received from the Executive Director of the Association of Danube Municipalities "Danube", which states that as an organization of 34 local authorities from the Danube region in Bulgaria, the association is located in the centre of the ecosystem for decarbonization of the Danube region. "We hope that together with the University of Ruse and other stakeholders we will be able to achieve an ambitious vision, turning the region

into an example of achieving Europe's climate goals."

Prof. Pencheva announced to the audience that in 2022 the team led by her will continue to work with several ambitious tasks, including the legalization of the vessel in the conditions of insufficient regulatory norms for this type of hybrids, related to innovation with hydrogen as a source of energy.

Several other activities are included in the field of research tasks of the research team: testing in real operating conditions, as well as evaluations of the efficiency of energy management, of energy costs at different loads, etc. A concept for training and demonstrations in a real hydrogen facility is also to be developed.

Traditional for such projects, the publicity of the scientific results obtained is also relevant. Some of these results have already been published in the form of accumulated expertise, shared at international scientific conferences.

Building HydRUforce, Bulgaria adds its contribution to the research for using low carbon energy in the domestic waterway transport of Europe. The hull of the vessel is a pontoon with a solar roof, built under the project "Clean access to the cross-border area Silistra- Călărași."

It is envisaged that the demonstration vessel will transport a maximum of 12 people with the crew, at a speed of 5-7 km /h upstream and 12-14 km /h downstream, respectively.

The vessel has a rectangular shape with the following specifications: length 10.5 m; width 4.5 m; height 2.5 m; weight 3.5 t. The propulsion of the vessel is provided by two electric motors with a maximum power of 10 kW and a nominal voltage of 48V. Each electric motor is connected to a group of 400Ah batteries with a voltage of 48V. In addition, two hydrogen fuel cells with a nominal power of 3 kW are connected to extend the buoyancy range; rated voltage 48 V; rated current 60 A; efficiency \geq 50%; Hydrogen operating pressure \leq 0.06 MPa and consumption of 361/min. Hydrogen for the fuel cells is provided by special 10-liter cylinders with a mass of 15.2 kg, a capacity of 1.8 cubic meters, and a mass of hydrogen only 0.150 kg, at a pressure of 20 MPa. One cylinder can keep the fuel cell running for 50 minutes. Solar panels with a total power of 7 kW are installed on the roof of the vessel to use the sun's energy to recharge the batteries.

Visits and Achievements

Meeting between universities in China and in the countries from Central and Eastern Europe

On 2 December 2021, in Ningbo, Zhedjan Province, China, and online, the 7th meeting of the Consortium of higher schools in China and the countries from Central and Eastern Europe was held. The common topic of the meeting was "The sustainable development of the cooperation in higher education between China and the countries from Central and Eastern Europe. The meeting was streamed due to the restrictions for the Covid 19 pandemic.



Representatives of 8 countries from Central and Eastern Europe - Bulgaria, Romania, Greece, Czech Republic, Poland, Hungary, Serbia and RS Macedonia took part online. Academician Hristo Beloev - Rector of the University of Ruse, presented the Vision for modernization of higher education at the University of Ruse and the cooperation with China in the panel session.

The topic was "Digital Transformation of Education in a Pandemic Context, Joint Nurture of Talent and Research Programs in Agriculture, Language Learning, Digital Economics and the Health Industry, University Cooperation". The Vice Rector for Internationalization and Communication Policy Assoc. Prof. Dr. Desislava Atanasova also took part in the meeting.

Opportunities for cooperation between universities and SMS with EIT

On 22 October 2021, the Rector of the University of Ruse Academician Hristo Beloev presented the Vision for modernization of the Ruse Alma Mater at a virtual Round table Opportunities for cooperation between universities and SMEs with EIT, organized on the initiative of the European Commissioner for Innovation, Research, Culture, Education and Youth Maria Gabriel and the Minister of Education and Science Academician Nikolay Denkov.

The forum was attended by the Minister of Economy Daniela Vezieva, the Director of the European Institute of Innovation and Technology (EIT) Martin Kern and Wesley Kroc – Head of Education and HEInnovate of (EIT).

Directors of innovation structures and research centres from Europe presented the challenges and results of investing in innovation, science and education, meeting the modern needs of the labour market in the context of globalization and digital transformation of societies to more than 130 participants.

Representatives of key stakeholders, business partners and the managements of Sofia and Ruse Universities discussed opportunities for cooperation and future initiatives.

The central topic of discussion was the modernization of higher education. The emphasis in the presentation of the University of Ruse was the regional and macro-regional importance of the university as a factor of positive change and









socio-economic progress through sustainable and targeted policy of prudent investment, cooperation and sharing of infrastructures and resources between partner public, private and non-governmental organizations leading to the development and intelligent specialization of the Danube region.

European Scientists Night 2021 at the University of Ruse

On 24 and 25 September 2021, the European Night of Scientists has once again been celebrated at the University of Ruse since 2006. The event was organized under the K-TRIO project (Knowledge gained in Training, Research and Innovation brings more Opportunities: K*(T+R+I)=O), coordinated by Sofia University, with the active participation of the University of Ruse as part of the project Consortium. The project is funded by Horizon 2020 and is aimed at initiating and conducting the European Night of Scientists in six Bulgarian cities - Burgas, Varna, Plovdiv, Ruse, Sofia and Stara Zagora, as its main goal is to raise public awareness of the importance of scientific research and the activity of scientists.

The European Night of Scientists 2021 was held under the motto Science and innovation is the key to the future we want, and one of the leading messages of the initiative Science and innovation is at the heart of Green and Digital Europe - served as a unifying thread of all events in the program of the University of Ruse.

On 24 September 2021 the Rector of the University of Ruse Cor. Mem. Prof. Hristo Beloev opened the event with the announcement of the results of the youth competition "Green innovations change lives". More than 15 competition entries were received in three categories - essay, drawing and presentation on the topic, which competed for the attractive prizes.

The exhibition "Green Ideas in Science and Everyday Life",

opened by the Rector in the central lobby of the University, aroused interest. The photos of Prof. Dr. Stepan Terziyan and Dr. Nikolay Kovachev excited the visitors with the power of their artistic messages for a clean, beautiful and greener environment. Special emphasis in the exhibition was placed through the photographs illustrating the public causes of the University Tourist and Environmental Society "Academic", convincingly demonstrated by Assoc. Prof. Dr. Rusi Minev, and the boards revealing the eco-bias of Assoc. Prof. Dr. Daniel Pavlov, show their eyes to the unknown face of scientists at the University of Ruse.

The next event in the program of the Night was the Discussion Club on "The European Green Deal and the Bulgarian Contribution" with the participation of Prof. Daria Vladikova and Dr. Maria Tsankova. Prof. Vladikova is an extremely authoritative name on a national and international scale in the field of hydrogen and fuel cells. She leads the national research program on low carbon energy, in which the University of Ruse is a partner and active participant. Maria Tsankova holds a PhD in Political Science from the University of Limerick and has been the Executive Director of the Association of Danube Municipalities since 2014. The guests in the discussion club presented the latest developments on the European Green Deal and outlined the prospects for Bulgaria in this regard.

Traditionally, one of the events with the most visitors in the program of the Night is Open Doors of Laboratories at the University of Ruse. This year, three of the laboratories at the university opened their doors to students from high schools in Ruse and the region - in Electronics with Assoc. Prof. Dr. Anelia Manukova, in Industrial Communications and Wireless Technology, where the enthusiastic team of Assoc. Georgi Hristov and Assoc. Prof. Plamen Zahariev work, and in Digital Layered Energy Systems with Head Pr. Assistant Professor Dr. Emil Yankov. Visitors had the opportunity to take on the role of "Scientists for a Day" and experience the curious and challenging world of science, attractively presented in one of the large halls of the university.

The next two events of the European Scientists' Night program at the University of Ruse were also aimed at the youth audience. In the debate on "Green Innovation" with the participation of students from the Mathematical and English High Schools in Ruse, the teams from the two elite high schools discussed the topic of green entrepreneurship and its relevance today, presenting their views "for" and "against" and showed how innovative ideas are born. Authoritative jury with the participation of Assoc. Prof. Dr. Desislava Atanasova, Assoc. Prof. Dr. Svilen Kunev and Tinka Arbe (a graduate of the University of Ruse with an impressive career at UBS-Zurich) praised the performance of the teams, with awards and certificates received by all participants.

In the scientific-applied workshop for doctoral students and young scientists on "One Green Europe" moderated by Assoc. Prof. Dr. Galina Ivanova were presented original ideas for the future of green and digital Europe through presentations of developments in the field of green transport technologies, renewable energy sources, green economy, etc. The event highlighted the participation of young scientists from the Department of Transport at the University of Ruse, who demonstrated the capabilities of a mobile laboratory for hydrogen and fuel cells. The promotion

And as every year, the

culmination of the program for the first day of the Night was the event "Scientists on Stage", in which talented representatives of the academic community of the university revealed the "unknown role" of scientists such as poet, musician, actor, artist, applicator or passionate photographer. The virtual stage of the University of Ruse gathered acquaintances and new faces, inspired by the vast world of literature and art. The moderator of the event was PhD student Tsveta Nenova, and the talented and imaginative performers were: Prof. Dr. Angel

Smrikarov, Prof. Dr. Stepan Terziyan, Dr. Iskra Ilieva, Dr. Nikolay Kovachev and Diana Georgieva with impressive presentations of their artistic hobbies; Assoc. Prof. Dr. Rusi Rusev - with exciting poetry from two new collections of poems, the last of which with illustrations and co-authored with his granddaughter Yanitsa; Dr. Petya Stefanova, Dr. Ivaylo Nikolaev and Dr. Milena Velikova - with talented musical performances that gathered a storm of applause in the chat on the virtual stage. For the first time, professors from Taraklia State University, Moldova, took part in the program of the Night, congratulating the academic community of the University of Ruse with talented musical and poetic performances. At the end of "Scientists on Stage" were the performances of the vocal-instrumental group "Tabula Raza" with the participation of Dr. Dimitar Grozev, Dr. Maya Grozeva, Dr. Sergei Kalinkov and Dr. Nina Tagarova. The event was conceived as a children's show and gathered many children on the site in front of the University Building 2. The young participants diligently helped Prof. Belovev and Assoc. Prof. Atanasova to plant the first trees in the Alley of Scientists' Night, and then had the opportunity to "drive" a cute car with a hydrogen cell and launch a police drone provided by lecturers from the laboratories of "Green Transport Technologies "and" Industrial Communications and Wireless Technologies ". The joyful emotions for the children continued with competitions and games under the charming guidance of the animators from "Veselyatsite", costumed like Spring and Autumn.

For the first time, the European Scientists' Night, organized by the University of Ruse, expanded its scope to include the branches of the University of Razgrad, Silistra, Vidin and Taraclia, Moldova (future branch). An alley of the Scientists' Night was launched in each of the branches, which will be enriched with new tree species every year.

A survey among Erasmus students

November 2021

In November 2021, Studentska Iskra newspaper in collaboration with the Erasmus office of the University of Ruse and senior inspector Diana Georgieva from International relations subdivision conducted a survey among the Erasmus students, studying at the University during the winter semester 2021 - 2022. The survey was focused on training in an epidemiological environment and the expectations of students in foreign countries. The questions and answers by Luis Thomas Walh Sylvester (Spain), Maria Rosario Martinez Rubio (Spain) and Matthew Jordan (France) showed that the youth-seeking spirit is characteristic of young people, despite the difficult situation in Europe.

1. What motivated you to come in Ruse for such a long period in times when most people avoid travelling abroad at all?

Luis Thomas (Es): Erasmus experience has always been something I've wanted to do for a long time. However, I have been doubting to do it during the last few years because of the situation and other factors. One of the reasons I decided to come was because one of my friends did Erasmus last year and it was an awesome experience for her and another friend was going to experience it this year. Other reason was because I was kind of demotivated with my studies and environment and I really needed a change in my life to open my mind. Plus, I've always wanted to visit or live in many places and this was a chance to live abroad and experience new cultures for some time.

Maria Rosario (Es): Because I like to know different countries and cultures and it was an opportunity to also practice languages.

Matthieu Jollard (Fr): I already visited in the past country from Eastern Europe such as Russia and I wanted to come back to East Europe.

2. How do you assess the COVID measures in the town and in the university in terms of studying and everyday life? If possible, compare them to the ones, applied in your city and/or university.

Luis Thomas (Es): Well, in the university the COVID measures are stricter

than in the town, but it's not that strict after all. However, it's fine since most of us are vaccinated. Where I live, the COVID measures were much stricter everywhere during the worst moments of the pandemic. Nowadays, things are better but we keep some measures, less strict, to avoid any new outbreak.

Maria Rosario (Es): The COVID measures in general in Ruse I have seen very lax for how the situation is. In Spain, the current COVID situation is good, so there are much fewer restrictions, but when it was bad, the restrictions were tougher than here.

Matthieu Jollard (Fr): Covid measure are almost the same here in Ruse and in France people need to wear a mask when entering a shop or a public building. But the university is still open in France.

3. Do you prefer online or face-to-face education in our university?

Luis Thomas (Es): In my opinion, face-to-face education is better or more comfortable here, since I live near the university and I share my room with more people who might be sleeping or focusing on other things at the time I have a lesson.

Maria Rosario (Es): I prefer face-to-face because it is better to meet classmates and teachers.

Matthieu Jollard (Fr): Of course I prefer being in a Classroom than in my room it was nice at the beginning of the crisis but now I can't focus more than 5 minutes when I am listening to an online lecture.

4. Do you feel safe here?

Luis Thomas (Es): Yes! I feel safe and comfortable here after some time.

Maria Rosario (Es): Yes, I always feel safe.

Matthieu Jollard (Fr): Yes, I feel safe.

Erasmus+ Programme

For the 7 years of the previous phase of the Erasmus+ Programme (2014–2020) the University of Ruse has been awarded 3 times for excellent implementation of mobility projects under the Programme. The highest recognition came on 25th June 2021 for the fourth time, during the conference, organized by the Centre for Human Resources Development at the opening of the new seven-year period of the programmes Erasmus+ and European Solidarity Corps (2021–2027).

At this official event, educational institutions which have implemented projects with outstanding contribution during the entire seven-year period (2014-2021) were awarded. The Minister of Education and Science conferred a Certificate for high quality project implementation for 2016-2017 to the Vice-rector of the University of Ruse, Assoc. prof. Desislava Atanasova, PhD.

In one academic year, in parallel with the traditional mobilities to EU countries, the University of Ruse carried out 144 mobilities with 19 universities from non-EU countries, with a budget of 342,894.00 Euros under the international mobility project and this was the highest budget among the Bulgarian universities that worked on this activity for the respective year.

The partners of the project were from 5 countries – Armenia, Georgia, Russia, Palestine and China. The training involved 6 Bulgarian and 54 international students, with 43 Bulgarian and 41 foreign lecturers giving lectures in host universities. Some of the lecturers participated in the International Erasmus week, organised by the University of Ruse, during which students and lecturers celebrated the 30th Anniversary of the Erasmus Programme together.

The success of the project is due to observing the principles of the Erasmus University Charter and the positive attitude and strong engagement of our Erasmus coordinators - Prof. Juliana Popova (University Erasmus Coordinator of the Year), Assoc. Assoc. Smrikarova, Assoc. Prof. Tsv. Harakchiyska, Assoc. Prof. L. Todorova, Assoc. Prof. L. Mikhailova, Prof. K. Grigorova, Assoc. Prof. E. Kolarov, Assoc. Prof. D. Pavlov, Assoc. Prof. N. Bencheva, Prof. St. Damyanov. The success of the project is evidenced by the overall satisfaction of the participants, expressed in the mandatory EU survey of the program and amounting to 100 percent, as well as the established image of the University of Ruse at the international level and in-depth cooperation with partner universities.


The initiator and club's Head for the entire period of its existence is Assoc. prof. Plamenka Hristova.

National Autumn University Championship in table tennis

Ceremony on naming of a sports hall

October, 2021

The work on the modernization of the sports facilities at the University of Ruse and the search for appropriate forms of cooperation with high schools and partner organizations in the field of sports and tourism continues despite the difficulties caused by the pandemic.

On October 6, 2021, the sports hall Academic-1 was named after Assoc. Prof. Dr. Joseph Ganev. The Rector of the University of Ruse Cor. Mem. Prof. Hristo Beloev, DTSC, together with the Deputy Regional Governor of Ruse Principal Assistant. Dr. Stefka Karakoleva solemnly unveiled the memorial plaque placed at the entrance of the hall. Dr. Karakoleva presented a congratulatory address on behalf of the District Governor of Ruse District Borislav Bulgarinov.

The representatives of the academic community, the media and the public also witnessed the signing of an Agreement for joint activities between the University of Ruse "Angel Kanchev" and the Sports School "Major Atanas Uzunov" - Ruse.

The finale of the celebration was set with the opening of the renovated gym of the university. The total investment for it exceeds BGN 10,000. The funds are entirely at the expense of the University of Ruse. All appliances have been updated and two more have been purchased. The floor is covered with new flooring, corresponding to the purpose of the hall

Assoc. Prof. Dr. Yosif Ganev is the first professor of physical education and sports at the University of Ruse. He laid the material and methodological foundations of education in the discipline of Physical Education and Sports at the University. In 1959 he became the first head of the newly formed Department of Physical Education and Sports and headed this department until 1985.

The contribution of Assoc. Prof. Dr. Yosif Ganev for the construction of the university sports base is significant. In 1964 the first sports hall Academic-1 was built and the open sports grounds in front of it. The development of the sports facilities during this period continues with the construction of the

football field and the athletics track around it.

The contribution of Assoc. Prof. Dr. Yosif Ganev for the involvement of students in active sports not only in the learning process, but also outside it is remarkable. On his initiative, the first university football and basketball tournaments were organized.

Assoc. Prof. Dr. Yosif Ganev has also contributed to the development of new, non-traditional sports at the University of Ruse, which are gaining popularity in our country in the 70s of last century. In 1970, the foundations of water skiing in the city of Ruse were laid and later - of figure skating with water skis. In the next few years, the University of Ruse established itself as a leading force in the field of water sports. After 1985, he continued to work actively on the methodology of teaching the discipline of Physical Education and Sports and on the scientific aspects of the training process in the preparation of sports teams. A significant part of these developments have found application in the work with student-athletes of the University of Ruse.
